An Ignatian Audit on Reimagining and Restructuring of all JHEASA Institutions as Witnesses of Hope

In line with the global Jesuit call for Reimagining and Restructuring (RR), JHEASA, under the guidance of President of the Jesuit Conference of South Asia, Fr. Stany D' Souza, who took the lead in steering this process across Jesuit higher education institutions in South Asia to draft a framework to conduct an assessment by appointing Fr Praveen Martis, SJ, Convener (SADU, Mangaluru), Fr M S Joseph Jacob SJ, (Loyola College, Chennai), Dr Alwyn D' Sa (SADU, Mangaluru), Dr Paul Newman (SJU, Bengaluru), Dr Marcus Barla, (SXC, Ranchi), Dr. Charlotte Simpson (SXC, Kolkatta), Fr Francis Pudhicherry SJ (DNC, Pune) and Fr Dominic Savio SJ (SXC, Kolkatta, JHEASA Secretary) as members. All the 82 JHEASA institutions would be covered under this process.

The team met from 4-6 August, 2025 at St Aloysius Institute of Management & Information Technology (AIMIT Centre), Mangaluru. The goal of this exercise is to ensure that our academic institutions remain vibrant, credible, and deeply responsive to the hopes and struggles of the communities we serve. This process is deeply rooted in the spirit of the Universal Apostolic Preferences (UAPs), particularly in showing the way to God, walking with the excluded, journeying with youth and caring for our common home.

In the context of the increasing presence of commercialised private universities and the proposal to allow 100 foreign universities into India which necessitate a profound re-examination of our own models of higher education. JHEASA is called not to compete on the same terms but to offer a counter narrative, a prophetic model that is value-oriented and socially committed.

Responding to the six focal areas articulated by the International Association of Jesuit Universities (IAJU), namely Global Citizenship, Promotion of Democracy, Mental Health and Well-being, Artificial Intelligence, Ecological Justice, and Refugees and Migrants, this study consciously prioritises the needs of first-generation learners, women, Dalits, Adivasis, children of migrant workers, refugees, orphans, LGBTQ and others from socioeconomically disadvantaged backgrounds. The team proposed a framework built on a 10 Core Criteria, enabling Jesuit higher education institutions across India to assess, reflect, and enhance their quality benchmarks in a manner that is systematic, evidence-based and mission-driven.

Objectives of the study include

1. To evaluate the present hierarchical structures, effectiveness and functioning of Jesuit Higher education Institutions in India, keeping the vision and mission of the institution in mind.
2. To plan for restructuring and reimagining
3. To understand the needs of the different stakeholders
4. To evaluate the satisfactory levels of the stakeholders in terms of their partnership/engagement with Jesuit institutions
5. To discuss and deliver future plans and directions for the institution according to the needs of the time

The proposed process is not just a mechanical exercise. It is a discernment journey, an invitation to all Jesuit institutions to undertake a SWOC (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Challenges) analysis that is not only rigorous and reflective but also grounded in dialogue with stakeholders. It aims to reinforce internal quality assurance mechanisms, support accreditation efforts, and chart out future directions in the spirit of shared mission and communal discernment.

This year's UbuCon Asia was organized by Ubuntu Nepal and GNOME Nepal, with St. Xavier's College as the Educational Partner. The two-day event saw an impressive turnout of over 450 participants and brought together enthusiasts, engineers, creators, researchers, entrepreneurs, and contributors from all around the world. Prominent international companies such as Canonical, DeepComputing, NextCloud, and OnlyOffice were represented by their founders, managers, and leaders.



Collaboration with College of Global Liberal Arts (GLA), Ritsumeikan University, Japan: Continuing the collaboration that began in 2022, St. Xavier's College, Maitighar and College of Global Liberal Arts (GLA), Ritsumeikan University, Japan jointly conducted a short-term course- Special Lecture (Social Science) for the 4th cohort from April 9, 2025. As a part of the course, a team of 8 students accompanied by Prof. Dr. Miwa Hirono, Associate Dean of Academic Affairs at GLA arrived in Kathmandu on August 31, 2025 for the field visit and was warmly welcomed at St. Xavier's College on September 1, 2025. On this occasion, certificates of completion were awarded to the 2025 cohort of the course comprising 11 SXC students.



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Students' representation at Philippines: Two Social Work students at the Department of Major Arts represented St. Xavier's College, Maitighar at the Service-Learning Student Fellowship Program 2025 (SLSF 2025) in Cebu City, Philippines. The event was organized by De La Salle University (DLSU) through the Uniservitate Asia and Oceania Regional Hub (UA&ORH) from August 3 to 11, 2025. SXC has been a UA&ORH member institution since 2024.





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Students Exchange Programme with Spain: Under the Erasmus+ KA171 Student Mobility Program, four students from three different departments of SXC, have been selected to pursue a semester from September 2025 to February 2026) at Universitat Politècnica de València (UPV), Spain. SXC also welcomed the exchange student from UPV, Spain, Ms. Inés Martínez Gabarda as an International Intern for 2025/26 in Project Wings to Dreams, 3D for Accessibility, an initiative by Chain For Change (CFC) in collaboration with St. Xavier's College, Maitighar.
