JHEASA Province Coordinators' Meeting 2025 at St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata



The Jesuit Higher Education Association of South Asia (JHEASA) held its annual Province Co-ordinators for Higher Education (PCHEs) Meeting from 19–21 September 2025 at St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata. The main purpose of the meet was to continue the reflection process on vitalizing Jesuit Higher Education in the present-day context, to share the success achieved in each province and to meet challenges unitedly by way of networking and sharing resources with each other. The event began with a fellowship dinner and included an inaugural address by Fr. Joe Arun, SJ, a sharing on the Reimagining and Restructuring Process, and a Eucharistic celebration. Afternoon inputs included an online message from Fr. Joseph Christie, SJ (Secretary for Higher Education, Rome) and an address by Fr. Stanislaus D'Souza, SJ (President, Jesuit Conference of South Asia). Discussions focused on implementing global concerns from the IAJU Assembly, Bogotá. On September 21, deliberations focused on zonal-level planning, a higher education policy for the assistantship, and strategies for networking and collaboration, in preparation for the upcoming JHEASA Conference in Mumbai. The meeting also approved the formulation of an Assistant Level Higher Education Policy and established six Task Forces to develop action plans based on IAJU agendas, involving staff, students, and alumni from each zone. Marked by reflection and collaboration, the meeting reaffirmed Jesuit higher education's commitment to aligning local initiatives with global priorities.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE TWO-DAY MEETING OF THE SOUTH ASIAN JESUIT PROVINCE CO-ORDINATORS FOR HIGHER EDUCATION (JHEASA) HELD AT ST. XAVIER'S COLLEGE, KOLKATA FROM 19TH TO 21ST SEPTEMBER, 2025

All the Jesuit Province Co-ordinators for Higher Education attended the three-day meeting called by the JHEASA Secretary, at St. Xavier's College, Kolkata from 19th to 21st September, 2025. The main purposes of calling for the meet was to continue the reflection process of vitalizing the Jesuit Higher Education in the present-day context, to share the success achieved in each province and to meet challenges unitedly by way of networking and sharing resources with each other.

The second purpose was to look at the main agendas that emerged at IAJU Assembly, Bogota, Colombia. The six agendas emerged at the Assembly were: (1) Students' Mental Health and Spiritual Health, (2) Ecological and Environmental Justice, (3) Migrants and Refugees, (4) Democracy, (5) Secularism and (6) Artificial Intelligence.

In successive sessions, the Province Co-ordinators shared their achievements, initiatives taken to respond to the emerging challenges and have agreed to network with each other to continue the process of re-imagining and re-structuring of Jesuit Higher Education in South Asia. Following initiatives were put in place for achieving the desired goals: -

A. Appointment of the Four Zonal Co-ordinators: -

- 1) North Zone: Fr. Augustine Thomas, SJ (Darjeeling and Nepal Province)
- 2) Central Zone: Fr. Pradeep Kerketta, SJ (Ranchi Province)
- 3) West Zone: Fr. John Rose, SJ (Mumbai Province)
- 4) South Zone: Fr. Louie Albert, SJ (Chennai Province)

Another important decision arrived at was to formulate Assistancy Level Higher Education Policy. The Policy framing committee was set up with the consent of the PCHEs. The committee consisted of: -

- 1) Fr. Rex Angelo, SJ (Andhra Province) – Convener
- 2) Fr. Arokiam Kulandai, SJ (Madurai Province)
- 3) Fr. M.K. Jose, SJ (Hazaribagh Province)

In addition, Six Task Forces have been set up to study the six agendas that emerged at the IAJU Assembly, Bogota, Colombia. The Task Forces are to come out with action plans meant for all the Jesuit Higher Education Institutions in South Asia. The following Convener will induct more members consisting of staff members, students and alumni, etc. from each zone.

- 1) Democracy: Dr. Paul Newman (Convener)
- 2) Secularism: Fr. A. Louie Albert, SJ (Convener)
- 3) Artificial Intelligence: Fr. John Ross, SJ ((Convener)
- 4) Student Mental Health and Spiritual Health: Fr. Melwyn Pinto, SJ (Convener)
- 5) Ecological and Environmental Justice: Fr. Paul Arokiam, SJ (Convener)
- 6) Migrants and Refugees: Fr. Pradeep Kerketta, SJ (Convener)

All the above-mentioned committees will call for meetings to chalk out plans to fulfill their responsibilities. They will present a report on the progress of their work in the forthcoming JHEASA Conference to be held in Mumbai from 26th to 28th January, 2026.

JHEASA West Zone Hosts "Be an Eco-Warrior" Student Camp Promoting Ecological Awareness and Sustainable Living



JHEASA West Zone organized a student camp titled "Be an Eco-Warrior" at the Xavier Training Centre, Desur, Belgaum, from September 25–27, 2025, bringing together forty students and faculty from five Jesuit institutions for an immersive ecological awareness programme. The sessions—"Restoring our Deep Connection with the Earth," "The Green Revolution: Capturing Green Energy for a Cleaner Tomorrow," and "Eco-Smart Living"—focused on sustainability, renewable energy, soil and personal health, and innovative eco-friendly practices such as circular economy and ecopreneurship. Participants also engaged in experiential learning through visits to Aduri and Rumewadi villages to study biogas units, women's empowerment, and microfinance models, and to ISKCON's Gokul Dham Eco-Village, where they witnessed sustainable living through organic farming and renewable energy use. Complemented by nature experiences like trekking to Chikhale waterfalls and exploring Rajhansgad Fort, the camp concluded with participants pledging to embrace ecological responsibility and sustainable lifestyles.
