## FEATURED NEWS FROM JHEASA MEMBER INSTITUTIONS

### NORTH ZONE JHEASA CONFERENCE

14<sup>TH</sup> TO 16<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2025, JESUIT CURIA, MATIGARA, DARJEELING.



The two-and-a-half-day meeting convened 28 Jesuit higher education leaders, lay collaborators, and academic administrators from the North Zone of the Jesuit Higher Education Association of South Asia (JHEASA) to reflect on contemporary challenges in higher education and discern mission-aligned leadership strategies in the context of the RRSJSA initiative. The gathering emphasized strengthening shared apostolic vision, aligning with national policies and accreditation frameworks, and enhancing institutional collaboration.

The North Zone JHEASA Conference, held from 14–16 November 2025 at the Jesuit Curia, Matigara, brought together 28 Jesuit leaders, lay collaborators, and academic administrators to reflect on contemporary challenges in higher education within the framework of the RRSJSA initiative. The gathering focused on strengthening a shared apostolic vision, improving alignment with national accreditation systems, and deepening institutional collaboration across the zone. The meeting opened with insights from Fr. Shajumon Chakkalakkal, S.J., and Fr. Dominic Savio, S.J., followed by discussions chaired by Ms. Saluja Chand, and concluded with a fellowship hosted by the SXC North Bengal Alumni. Key sessions addressed global educational trends, NAAC and NIRF preparedness, the RRSJSA audit framework, Jesuit–lay leadership, and opportunities for regional collaboration. Participants committed to enhancing leadership formation, standardizing documentation for audits, strengthening accreditation readiness, and advancing digital and innovation-driven pedagogy. Institutions also agreed to update MoUs, participate in upcoming workshops, and engage in cross-campus visits to foster greater unity. Daily Eucharistic celebrations reinforced spiritual grounding and apostolic fraternity. The conference concluded with a renewed resolve to cultivate mission-driven, collaborative, and future-ready leadership capable of responding to evolving national and global educational realities.

### WEST ZONE JHEASA CONFERENCE

27<sup>TH</sup> AND 28<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2025 AT ST. XAVIER'S COLLEGE, MUMBAI



The JHEASA West Zone Think Tank Session on “Transitioning into a University” brought together Jesuit leaders, academicians, administrators, and delegates from multiple Jesuit higher education institutions. The session explored the need, feasibility, mission-alignment, and road map for Jesuit institutions in the West Zone to move toward Cluster University formation.

The West Zone JHEASA Conference, held on 27–28 November 2025 at St. Xavier's College, Mumbai, brought together Jesuit leaders, academicians, and administrators to explore the vision, feasibility, and mission-aligned roadmap for transitioning Jesuit institutions into a Cluster University model. Rooted in the Ignatian mission of forming “men and women for others,” the discussions examined how Jesuit higher education must evolve in response to NEP 2020, technological disruption, widening inequalities, and the growing need for autonomy and innovation. Key presentations by Fr. Joseph Christie, SJ, Fr. Dominic Savio, SJ, Fr. Learoy Rodrigues, SJ, Fr. Keith D'Souza, SJ, and Fr. Frazer Mascarenhas, SJ, highlighted the need for integrated student formation, mission-rooted leadership, inter-institutional collaboration, and strategic restructuring toward university status. The conference also featured leadership from the HSNC Cluster University, whose successful journey—marked by academic freedom, faster decision-making, expanded research, financial stability, and adaptability to emerging technologies—offered a compelling model for Jesuit institutions. Participants from Mumbai, Pune, Goa, and Jamshedpur emphasized that while challenges such as regulatory constraints, minority rights concerns, financial and land limitations, and personnel shortages remain significant, the benefits of a Cluster University far outweigh them. The consensus affirmed that Jesuit institutions must adopt a mission-driven, collaborative, future-ready approach, pooling resources, strengthening leadership, and embracing structural change to ensure long-term sustainability, academic excellence, and deeper societal impact.

### Rev. Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ, Meets the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Calcutta

Rev. Dr. Dominic Savio, SJ, Principal of St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Kolkata, paid a courtesy visit to Prof. Asutosh Ghosh, the newly appointed Vice-Chancellor of the University of Calcutta, on 3rd November 2025. The meeting took place at the Vice-Chancellor's chamber at the University.



During the interaction, Rev. Dr. Savio warmly congratulated Prof. Ghosh on assuming the prestigious office and conveyed his best wishes for a fruitful and inspiring tenure. The discussion reflected mutual respect and a shared commitment to strengthening academic collaboration between St. Xavier's College and the University of Calcutta. Both academic leaders emphasized the importance of maintaining the long-standing association between the two institutions, which have historically worked together in the pursuit of excellence in higher education and research.

The meeting concluded on a cordial note, with Rev. Dr. Savio expressing his hope that the University, under Prof. Ghosh's leadership, will continue to achieve new milestones in academic innovation and service to society.

### St. Aloysius, (Deemed to be University) Mangaluru, Student Awarded Prestigious Charpak Scholarship



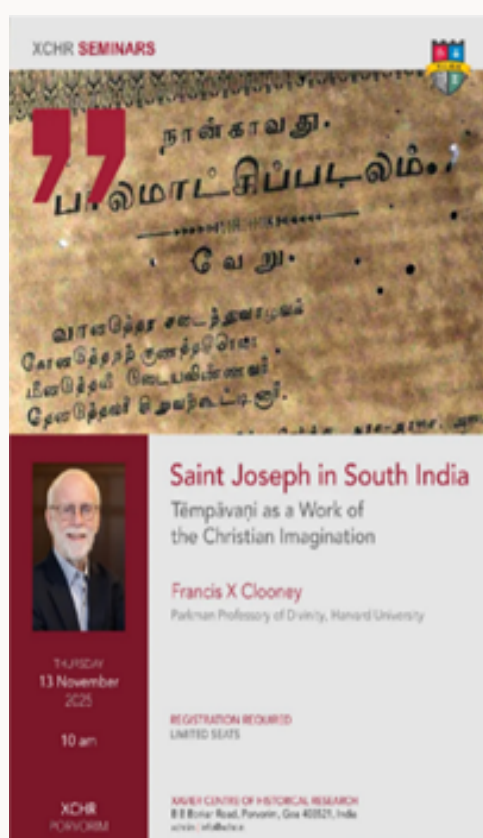
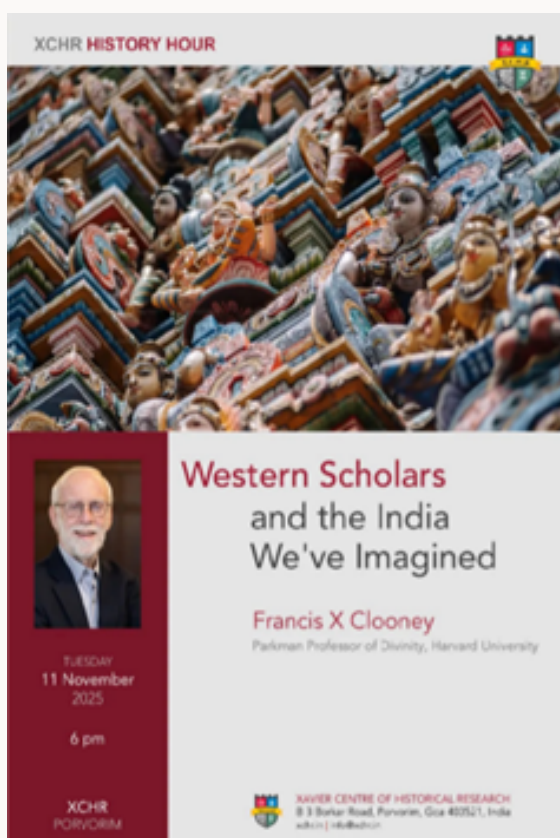

Lecture session on “Western Scholars and the India We’ve Imagined” and “Saint Joseph in South India : Tēmpāvaṇi as a Work of the Christian Imagination” held at Xavier Centre of Historical Research, Goa in collaboration with Francis X Clooney, Parkman Professor of Divinity, Harvard University, Massachusetts



Xavier Centre of Historical Research, Goa, in collaboration with FrancisX Clooney, Parkman Professor of Divinity, Harvard University, Massachusetts, organized a Lecture session pertaining to the ‘History Hour’ category on November 11, 2025 from 6 p.m., titled — “Western Scholars and the India We’ve Imagined”. Anu K Antony, Assistant Professor, Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, BITS Pilani, Goa, acted as moderator of this session. The lecture delved into how Westerners have interpreted and constructed Hindu traditions over many centuries, evaluating the mixed results of these interpretations, acknowledging both the positive and negative influences and contributions of Western scholarship. The lecture concentrated on offering a brief overview of this long encounter, examining in detail the strengths and weaknesses of the Christian missionary scholarly tradition, showcasing how this tradition has shaped the study of Hinduism.

Another academic seminar with Prof. Clooney was organized on November 13, 2025 from 10 a.m to 12 noon titled — “Saint Joseph in South India : Tēmpāvaṇi as a Work of the Christian Imagination”. The seminar examined Tēmpāvaṇi as a creative encounter between Christianity and Tamil literary culture, showcasing a masterful blending of literature across religions and cultures — The 4000 verse-long poem composed in an elegant Tamil style, is certainly the most famous work of Costanzo Gioseffo Beschi (1680-1747), an Italian Jesuit missionary who worked for decades in Tamil Nadu, South India.
